5	Write an imaginary story about a snow day adventure.	Write 5 winter maths word problems for your friends (include addition, subtraction, multiplication, division or fractions). You must be able to explain how to solve them!	Write a list of (at least 6) curious questions about Christmas or winter?	Write a descriptive poem about snow. Include an adverb, verb, simile or metaphor and adjective in each verse. Remember to explore all your senses in the poem.	Write a fact file about an animal that lives in a snowy habitat.
4	Make a snowball and bring it inside. How long can you keep it cold for without putting it in the fridge freezer? What can you remember about insulators and conductors to help you?	I am stuck in the snow! Come and rescue me! How will you do it?	Create a winter quiz! We can ask the class when we get back in!	Write instructions for making hot chocolate (and drink it!)	How many words can you think of related to snow and ice? Can you think of one for each letter of the alphabet?
3	Find a winter poem and practice reading it with expression. Can you learn it off by heart? I would love to hear it!	Imagine Father Christmas's elves have decided to go on strike – how will you persuade them to get back to work in time for Christmas!	Carefully, use white paper and scissors to create a symmetrical snowflake.	Make a model of a something snowy or Christmassy e.g. snowman/angel/Santa/snow palace using recycled materials.	Cook up a treat Ask an adult to help you make a Winter Warmer. What will you make? Mince pies? Soup? Reindeer biscuits? Or make some cookies and decorate them creatively.
2	Read two chapters of your book. What happened in those two chapters? Write down the two most impressive words you read.	Create the perfect winter menu. What would be your ideal meal for the chilly, wintry months?	Build a snow fort (or a warm inside fort made from blankets).	Write me some snowy jokes. Q: <i>How does a penguin build a house?</i> A: <i>Igloos it together.</i>	Build the tallest snowman you can OR build an igloo!
1	Go for a walk with a grown-up and take a camera to capture some lovely winter photographs.	Create a piece of snow art – it could be a snow animal or a landscape. You can only use natural materials.	Draw a portrait of someone you are spending the day with.	Investigate: Where does snow melt quickest?	FREE CHOICE Whatever you choose, I will be interested to see what it is!!
